WHO'S INVITED: Williamsburg residents and their extended families (e.g., grown kids, grandparents, cousins, aunts, uncles).

- 30 Williamsburg families need to RSVP/Yes by Wed., June 3 in order for the Parade & Picnic to happen. We need a critical mass of WHOA families to be there to justify the expense.
- An eVite is being sent to Williamsburg residents. Residents can share with relatives to invite them, too.
- Those RSVP'ing will be notified by Fri., June 5 if the Parade & Picnic is going forward.

END OF SCHOOL PARADE & PRIZES: Parade will start at the Williamsburg Park, going through Richmond Lane and back to the Park.

NEXTDOOR.COM/WILLIAMSBURG ESTATES. All the Board members plus 25 other Williamsburg residents have been part of a pilot with a Neighborhood Network site called Nextdoor for the last two months. Nextdoor/Williamsburg Estates is a private blogging/social network site that provides Williamsburg Estates residents the opportunity to share information with Williamsburg residents only or to share info with as many as 25 other neighborhoods in the Keller area. With Nextdoor/Williamsburg Estates, neighbors share community events, recommendations, items for sale/free, crime/safety concerns, ideas about how to make our neighborhood(s) better, and more. 24/7 Medication Trash Drop-off Program

Don't throw unused medication down the toilet or in the trash! You pollute the ground and water. Instead use the new Keller Police Dept. (KPD) facility to dropoff unused medication so it can properly be disposed of in partnership with CVS Pharmacy.

KPD will accept expired or unwanted <u>prescription and over-the-counter medications</u> 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Dropoff is easy with a CVS/ pharmacy-sponsored drug collection unit



housed in the after-hours lobby of the Keller Police Dept. building at 330 Rufe Snow Drive.

The new service is free and open to anyone.

Note: KPD cannot accept the following: thermometers, needles (sharps), medications from businesses or clinics, ointments, lotions or liquids, aerosol cans, inhalers or hydrogen peroxide. For more information, please contact the Keller Police Department at 817-743-4500.

WHAT'S COOKING IN THE 'BURG?









Prep Time: 10 minutes

Cook Time: 45 minutes

Calories: 350

Difficulty: Easy

SWEET POTATOES with FENNEL, APPLES & PECANS

Ingredients

cups), sliced into ½ inch thick pieces

3 green apples, peeled, cored and cut into ¾ inch rounds

2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil

1/2 teaspoon sea salt

1½ pounds peeled sweet potatoes (about 3 medium 1 large fennel bulb, cored and sliced into ½ inch thick pieces (reserve green fronds for garnish)

3 tablespoons maple syrup

1/3 cup raw unsalted pecans

Method

Preheat oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit

Using a baking sheet or large ovenproof dish, toss the ingredients in the olive oil and maple syrup. Sprinkle with 1/2 teaspoon salt and spread in one layer.

Roast until sweet potatoes are soft on the inside, rotating occasionally. (About 40 minutes.) Remove from oven and sprinkle with pecans, return oven for another 5 minutes. Adjust seasoning and serve warm garnished with fennel fronds.
